Your contribution of funds and materials helped make the continued renovation of a First Mesa home possible, and supported several other projects as well during our time on the Hopi & Navajo Nations last week.

We are thankful to share that, thanks to your help and the materials you contributed, 2 new windows were installed at the home next door to Dorothy's, along with a new door and toilet. Running water has been reconnected to the home after 4 years without a water connection, and the extra window and lumber you donated were also used to help build an addition onto a tiny home for a Navajo elder.

Quite literally, your community is the reason a young Hopi family and a Navajo elder have safe shelter now. You have helped make their houses into homes, and for that, we are so grateful!

The mother of the young Hopi family whose home was fixed, Janalda, asked me to pass her gratitude along to you and all who helped make the repairs possible: "One of my dreams is to bring back Sunday dinners for my family. You guys are helping bring that dream closer to reality."

This work only gets done when partners like the LOC/Bethlehem community step into kindness and courage to lend a helping hand - thank you, from the bottom of our hearts.

Season of Creation: An Ecumenical Effort of Christian Churches

The following quotes are from church leaders who urge support of the Season of Creation and, more importantly, encourage actions to make our planet more sustainable.

What can ordinary people do about climate change?

- Drive less;
- Buy electric;
- •Support candidates who are working for a green economy.

"Despite all attempts to deny, conceal, gloss over or relativize the issue, the signs of climate change is increasingly evident. No one can ignore the fact that in recent years we have witnessed extreme weather phenomena, frequent periods of unusual heat, drought and other cries of protest on the part of the earth that are only a few palpable expressions of a silent disease that affects everyone.
