



These are the last days before the election on November 5th. The campaign season has been unprecedented for its hate-filled speech, misinformation and lies, conspiracies, and even physical violence. So much is at stake in this election including the basic structures of our democratic institutions. Perhaps it is not an exaggeration to say that the future of the planet is also at stake in this election. We have been presented with two candidates running for our country's highest office, offering vastly different views on climate policies and programs. One candidate promis-
