

Where IS Synod being held? In Estes Park at the YMCA of the Rockies. (2515 Tunnel Rd, off of the Beaver Meadows RMNP entrance)

When does Synod start/end? Opening ceremonies start at 7pm on Friday. Closing prayer is on Monday at 11am.

Who can attend Synod? Each parish has delegates who participate, but all are welcome to observe. Observers must be register.

What is happening at Synod? <u>Schedule</u>

Will there be Mass at Synod? An All-Communion Mass will be held at 10am in the Hyde Chapel on Sunday morning. Registration is not needed to attend the Mass. Celebrating Indigenous Peoples Day

Many communities in the U. S. celebrate the second Monday in October as Indigenous Peoples Day replacing the traditional holiday of Columbus Day. Indigenous Peoples Day began in 1992 to protest the historical conquest of North America by Europeans, and to call attention to the losses suffered by the Native American peoples and their cultures through diseases,

Join us for our bell ringing service on October 11 at 11:00 AM. We pray for the healing of the earth and for all those who have been impacted by climate change, especially the most vulnerable communities.

warfare, massacres, and forced assimilation. It can be a day of reflection on the history of the United States and the role Native peoples have played in it; the impacts that history has had on Native people and communities; and also a day to gain some understanding of the diversity of Indigenous peoples.

In an effort to restore a "right relationship" with native peoples, communities have written land acknowledgements which are statements of belief and acknowledgement that Indigenous tribes occupied specific local lands before white settlement. Every month during the prayers for climate justice at the LOC bell ringing event, community members read a land acknowledgement. Participants understand that this land acknowledgment is only effective if we believe that the earth is meant to be shared and that public lands are open to all.

We acknowledge the past genocide of the native peoples of Colorado on whose ancestral land we gather. We recognize that we are part of a colonial past that forcibly removed the Cheyenne, the Arapahoe, and the Ute nations from this land. We seek to be true allies with our native brothers and sisters pursuing justice and fair treatment in all things. In this month when we celebrate Indigenous People's Day, we honor the diverse and vibrant Native community members who currently make their home here in Boulder County today. May we all learn to be stewards of this earth as we absorb the wisdom of our land's first peoples.
