

Solar in our Future? Since mid-July, a group of four parishioners from Bethlehem Lutheran (BL) and LOC representative, Helen Majzler, have been meeting regularly to answer the question: Should BL replace its current energy system with solar? What would it take (financially and technically) to switch to "green" energy? What are the short and long-term benefits for BL and the local community?

To answer these questions the work team sought and studied solar proposals from a variety of local solar companies. Additionally, the team looked into financing options that included rebates, grants, loans, and fundraising opportunities.

With the support of BL's parish council the solar project team is now ready to present its findings and recommendations to the larger BL congregation who will ultimately vote on the proposal and move the project forward or not.

An educational forum has been planned to allow church members to hear and discuss the proposal and to ask questions.

This forum will take place on **Monday October 14 at 7:00 PM via ZOOM.** LOC members are invited to attend and participate but, because we are building tenants, will not vote on the proposal. A zoom link will follow in a separate email as the date approaches.

Climate Change and Indigenous Peoples

Colorado officially replaced Columbus Day with the annual celebration of Indigenous Peoples Day. It takes place on Monday October 14. During the month of October, we will focus on the needs, concerns, and words of Native peoples.

What can ordinary people do about climate change?

Braiding Sweetgrass is now available in a Young Adult version. Do you know a young person who would enjoy reading it? Buy them a copy and discuss it with them. You may be nurturing the next Greta Thunberg.

In 2015 historian Roxanne Dunbar-Ortiz published An Indigenous Peoples' History of the United States. In it she states that today in the US, there are more than five hundred federally recognized Indigenous nations comprising nearly three million people, descendents of the fifteen million Native people who once inhabited this land. The centuries-long genocide of these people has been largely omitted from history books. U.S. policies toward Indigenous peoples were designed to seize their lands, displacing and/or eliminating them in the process. The ruthlessness of this policy reached its zenith under President Andrew Jackson with the Indian Removal Act in 1830 that resulted in the "Trail of Tears."

At the same time we have ignored this settler-colonial history, the contributions and aspirations of Indigenous people have also been ignored. To bridge the divide, Robin Wall Kimmerer, a botanist and member of the Citizen Potawatomi Nation is using the tools of science and the healing knowledge of Indigenous peoples to bring us closer together. Kimmerer wrote her famous book, Braiding Sweetgrass, to help readers learn about the reciprocal relationship between the earth and humans. She said that it's time all humans love and respect plants and animals as demonstrated by Indigenous peoples. She believes that, if we combat the erasure of indigenous ways of knowing, it can help bring us to a healed relationship with the land. The book highlights the importance of listening to the languages of other living beings to understand the "generosity of the Earth, and learn to give our own gifts in return." Kimmerer shares her wisdom through stories which end in deep appreciation for the gifts of creation.
