

Veterans Day

Monday is Veterans Day, the date that marked the end of hostilities following World War I. All over this country veterans are remembered for their service in that war and all those wars that followed; for giving their lives as the ultimate sacrifice to bring peace. At the same time we celebrate our military personnel, we are not naive about the growing amount of vio-

lence, conflict and war that is raging around the globe. We are appalled by the loss of human lives and the massive displacement of civilian populations caught in the middle of wars, particularly in Ukraine and in Palestine. We also acknowledge the extensive destruction of lands, farms, rivers, cities, and infrastructure from the wholesale bombing of cities. Communities have been reduced to rubble and civilians live in despair.

While we watch this violence from afar, our own holiday celebration is muted this year by the sobering realization that our country has experienced a series of climate disasters that have been unprecedented in scope and impact. In late September hurricane Helene

cut a 500 hundred mile path of destruction through the southeastern United States, with 15-foot storm surges in Florida and flooding and mudslides in the mountains of North Carolina and Tennessee. Six states have seen the most damage: Florida, Georgia, North and South Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia. Entire towns were nearly wiped off the map and the death toll is already well over 230.

Climate change has exacerbated conditions that allow such storms to thrive, rapidly intensifying in warming waters and turning into powerful cyclones sometimes within hours. This disaster drives home the fact that no place is safe from the impacts of climate change. Instead of trying to escape climate change, we need to solve this problem, drastically cutting emissions now.
