Adult Formation notes

Why do I care about climate change?

- As a **parent**, I care about what the years ahead will be like for my children and their children.
- As a believing/practicing **Christian**, I understand that I and others have a gospel obligation to care for my neighbor and the well being of the planet.

What can ordinary people do about climate change?

Write your own reflection on why you care about climate change.

- As a **member of a rich and prosperous country**, I have benefited from consumer products that have disproportionately polluted the atmosphere compared to other less developed countries and therefore bear a greater burden for the clean up and restoration of the planet.
- As a **woman**, I know that the worst impacts of climate change will disproportionately affect women and children and I can empathize with their anxiety and urgent requests for help.
- As a **consumer** I worry about farmers and whether they will be able to produce enough food especially during times of sustained drought, flooding, or civil unrest.
- As an **animal lover**, I fear that some species of insects, birds, animals will not survive on a planet that is too hot or has undergone ecological changes too quickly for their adaptation.
- As a **community member**, I have already experienced the polarization of the issue and the social unease that will likely continue as communities discuss and strategize ecological priorities and action steps.
- As a budget conscious **citizen**, I think that it's always more economical to invest in prevention strategies than to constantly pay the high costs of disaster cleanups which have lately amounted to billions from our collective coffers.
- As a **planner and activist**, I don't like to be caught off guard; nor am I a fatalist waiting around for the inevitable disaster. We know that they will come and we have had ample warning to get our "ducks in a row." This isn't someone else's problem to fix. It's mine and ours to do now.

I think that there is still time to make the changes we need to turn this thing around. We just have to get serious and get to work, starting with ourselves.
