Adult Formation notes

COP 29

By most accounts, the outcome of the global climate meeting (Nov. 11-22) called **COP 29** in Baku, Azerbaijan was a huge disappointment. It was intended to lay out a formula and provide money to developing nations so that they could transition to clean energy and prepare their nations for climate disasters. The final proposal asked wealthy nations to provide \$300 billion a year to help poorer nations make the energy

transition and adapt to climate change. This is only a fraction of what is needed. Estimates suggest that developing nations need around \$1 trillion a year. Developing nations left Baku angry and frustrated with the outcomes.

COP stands for **Conference of Parties.** It's an annual meeting under the direction of the United Nations and has been the only place where any measure of global accountability for reducing greenhouse gases (GHG) takes place. In 2015, COP 21, one of the most famous and consequential, was held in Paris. The participating nations seemed to take climate change seriously. At COP 21, 197 countries adopted and officially launched it's principal goal of "limiting global warming to well below 2, preferably to 1.5 degrees Celsius, compared to pre-industrial levels." Neither the US nor China were signatories to the Paris Agreement. In fact, then President Trump in 2017 pulled the US out of the Paris talks.

Next year COP 30 will take place in Belem, Brazil. It will be interesting to see what role the US will play under the new Trump administration. He has promised to expand fossil fuel production, even drilling for oil and gas in our most pristine environments. He has also promised environmental deregulation, rolling back hard won EPA safeguards.

For those who care deeply about protecting our precious earth, and the future we are leaving our children, this moment may feel unbearable. And so we may need time to process, to feel deeply, and to lament. Climate change is real and it is here, and we need and deserve bold leadership to address the problems we face. Let us encourage each other to find ways to press for climate action wherever possible in spite of government inaction. Our work is a moral calling for which we will not be deterred.
