# Going Deeper With God. A Discussion with Deacon Mike


### **Online Lenten Retreat**



# **Discretionary Fund Team**

During 2025, Deacon Mike Weil will be joining us as part of his internship for the priesthood. This team will research organizations based on needs and consider things like:

- 1) what needs are being met through monies donated,
- 2) how does this donation reflect the mission statement of Light of Christ
- 3) what type of charitable rating does the organization have ensuring that monies are getting to the ones who need assistance.
