

#### Did you know?

- + The word 'Lent' comes from the Old English 'Lencten', meaning Spring season.
- + The practices of Lenten sacrifice (what you will forgo during Lent) and Lenten Discipline (additional spiritual practices) continue a tradition observed by Moses, Elijah and Jesus, who fasted and prayed in preparation for their respective ministries.
- + 'Fish on Friday' comes out of the prohibition against eating meat (the flesh of warm-blooded animals) on Friday, the day Christ died. This tradition can be traced back to the first century.
- + The wearing of ashes on Ash Wednesday is a sign of repentance that goes back to biblical times. The ashes are prepared by burning the palm fronds from the prior year's Palm Sunday celebration.





#### **Social Justice Presentations**

LoC hosts several presentations each year on various social justice topics. These discussions are open to the public and include the Stations of the Cross public presentation throughout Longmont.

#### **Growing Gardens**

LoC supports Growing Gardens, a nonprofit community garden project at the church that grew and donated over 5,000lbs of food to local food banks.

#### **Pride Fest**

LoC has supported Longmont Pride in June for many years with a table promoting our hospitality and a Communion Service where all are welcome to receive.

#### **Annual Mission Trips**

LOC adults collaborate with Bethlehem
Lutheran adults for an annual mission
trip, traveling to places all over the nation
and building shelter to disadvantaged
