From the Adult Formation Committee Plastic-Free July

Annually, millions of people across the globe, through a grassroots campaign called Plastic Free July, remind us of the need to address plastic pollution. Since the invention of plastic in 1907, plastic has become so pervasive, making its way into every part of our lives and into the environment. Scientists have found bits of plastic residue, microplastics, in oceans that are literally hundreds of miles from permanent human habitation. Birds and marine animals are absorbing these plastic fragments at their own peril. Today we are coming to terms with the damaging consequences to human health, natural ecosystems, and the climate.

The Adult Formation Committee (AFC) invites you to join us this July in challenging ourselves to examine our use of single-use plastic, otherwise known as disposable plastic, and to find better alternatives. Even if plastic is marked recyclable, we know that 90% of plastic is never recycled after it is discarded. Only 9% of plastic waste gets recycled. The rest is burned or dumped, adding to climate warming and toxicity.

Ecocycle, Boulder's recycling facility, points to the following as examples of single-use plastic items causing damage to the environment: plastic bread bag tags, plastic bottles, Styrofoam takeaway containers, plastic straws, plastic packaging materials, plastic cutlery, and plastic single-use shopping bags.

Each week in July, we will propose a single-use plastic alternative. Look for them in the weekly bulletin.

Registration – help register people before the event, and then check them in the day of the event

Liturgy – plan the closing Liturgy for the day, with presider Bishop Kae, including blessing of Chrism oils.

Music – musicians and vocalists needed for Mass. We anticipate a rehearsal sometime during the week prior to Synod

Please consider this important volunteer opportunity and if you have any questions, reach out to one of the current Parish Council members, who are listed on the front of each bulletin and this newsletter.


In the Spotlight this month: Communications

Two important teams at LOC include the Communications
Committee and the Marketing Team. The Communications
Committee works to create an awareness of LOC on a local,
regional, and national level. It oversees and coordinates public
relations, advertising, and press releases. Most of this work is
done by LOC staff, who maintain our website, Christmas and Easter

newspaper ads, Facebook page, and Instagram page as well. For internal communication, a monthly newsletter and weekly bulletins are created. These documents are printed and available at Mass on Saturdays, and are distributed via the All Parish Email system. LOC members and friends should sign up for the all parish emails to be up to date on all the latest happenings at the church.

The Marketing team was created in 2023 to focus on working with the marketing consultant on developing a new logo, tagline, and website for Light of Christ. The group continues to meet to create marketing materials for specific events and to expand the visibility of LOC in focused ways outside our normal communication efforts. Currently this team is designing stickers and vinyl clings that should be available soon, and preparing a survey for the community to explore the viability of an idea they have to increase membership. From time to time, we all have little things around the house that we could use help with.


Last month, our friends at Bethlehem
